#### **Market Review**

The third quarter of 2013 has been positive for equity investors, with both the U.S. and Canadian markets participating on the upside.

The most challenging sectors have been "safe" sectors where rising bond yields have caused corrections in bonds, preferred shares, utilities, telecoms, REITS and pipeline stocks. These are valued as steady income producers and as bond yields rise their cash flows look less attractive by comparison.

#### **Fixed Income**

The bond correction that started on May 22<sup>nd</sup> continued this quarter, with interest rates rising.

Most of our corporate higher yielding bonds have held in very well, but the preferred share indexes have corrected by 2.56% year to date, and the preferred shares that we hold have corrected as well. Year to date the best fixed income investment has been daily interest accounts. So while many of you have been frustrated having so much of your portfolios in daily interest accounts, these have protected you from losses in bonds and given you "dry powder" for when opportunities inevitably start to surface.

There are now a few good opportunities in the bond and preferred share markets, while 3, 6, and 9 months ago there were virtually none. Some of these opportunities are thinly traded so we have to buy them very gradually so we don't bid the prices up.

### **Income Producing Equities**

The trend from last quarter has continued, with the interest sensitive shares (REITs, Pipelines, Utilities) continuing to weaken and companies that benefit from rising rates (banks and insurers) hitting new 52 week, and in some cases, all-time highs.

Fortunately 6 out of 10 of our largest equity positions are banks and insurers, so most of your portfolios are participating well in this environment.
